It has been a 'ruff' year to say the least. COVID starting right before our Dance into Spring event so that had to be cancelled, along with many other activities we participate in. We were lucky to have permission to have our Dice Run, and although it was much smaller scale our 5k race was run virtually. We definitely had to pull out our creativity and ingenuity to make ends meet. Because even though the fundraising was down, we still had massive vet bills and many animals to care for.

This year alone we experienced several kittens with birth deformities in their legs, numerous cases of parvovirus, and many animals which should have received previous veterinary care didn't and so we had to care for those cases once we received them. We had less donations coming in due to schools and other organizations not being able to gather goods.

Please meet Spartacus, formerly known as Paul in his former home. Yes these pictures are graphic and disturbing. But people need to know what we see in our line of work. It's not all playing with puppies and kittens. It is hard work daily cleaning and making sure the animals are given the basics of food, water, and shelter, but then we have to incorporate mental and physical stimulation. Anything it takes to keep them happy and healthy. But we rarely share the deep dark side of our roles in rescue. We try to show the happiest of tails, but we workers see most often the fails of our society. We see the after effects when someone gets a puppy because it's cute. But then don't do the basic needed veterinary care. And then with no veterinary care to start out with, once the animal gets sick and then that human doesn't want to be burdened with caring for this now sick animal. So they tie them outside, discarded to the side like a piece of garbage. An inanimate object. Well Spartacus is no piece of garbage. He is a treasure to be loved. Thankfully when poor Paul/Spartacus was put outside like a bag of garbage, the neighbors called to report on his health. Local police checked into the call. No real answer as to why he looks like he does, just that they didn't have the money and didn't know what was wrong. And so Paul was surrendered over so he can be properly cared for. He had an immediate visit with our veterinarian (Mountain State Veterinary Services) and received a skin scrape, blood work panel, and whatever else was needed to assess him. He has both types of mange, Demodectic and Sarcoptic (which is very transmissible between animals and humans). He also had severe Whipworms that basically allowed for no nutrition to enter his body, thus starving him from the inside out. He had infection throughout his body. It is hard to quarantine an animal like that in a shelter. But we make do, staff take turns caring for him, all the while being aware of possible cross contamination with other animals (and humans with the Sarcoptic mange). The worst part is because we have to limit exposure with him, he is craving attention so badly and we just can't give it as freely as we want. But this work in progress is progressing wonderfully. He has put on weight (with a controlled feeding schedule), his skin looks smooth and we should see real hair growth over the next few weeks. We are now healthy enough to get vaccinated. And fingers crossed when we do our next skin scrape the mange will be negative so we can start running and playing outside with people and other four-legged friends. Spartacus will survive and thrive! We believe he will be a rather big dog (in the 60-70 range when he gains all his weight back) and looks to be a collie mix.

Please keep an eye out on our Facebook page as we will be posting him soon so everyone can follow his journey to wellness.

And when the time comes, he will be available for adoption. Donations for his care would be greatly appreciated as he has required a few veterinary visits.

These will be popular long after 2020.


